- Bring your own drinks and stay in your pods (socially distanced of course) or enjoy a pub beer in their garden in your pods
- Barflys are welcome but please sign up too (for contact tracing purposes)
- Read the comments on the booking spreadsheet for any additional instructions/guidance for that run Have fun, and if you have an idea for a trail, hares will be needed going forward!



#2179 Devils Dyke – Finally, a proper numbered r*n after a few weeks of micro hashing! Covid survivor Ride-It, Baby was the catalyst to get us back together: as it was her turn to set trail for the Hove group, she suggested that other groups might wish to come along to the same location and follow her trail at intervals. After beating out the details, checking the guidance, and assessing interest levels the idea was deemed worthy of a trial, and Keeps It Up set up a Google docs booking sheet on the website with slots for 6 runners or walkers setting off at 15 minute intervals from 6.30pm onwards. To start with the Hove group were down to lead off proceedings but Zoomers were worried about getting back in time so there was a bit of a change around. On arriving at the car park we were greeted by RIB who'd changed things further and we discovered that her co-hare, Lily the Pink,

would be leading mine and Angels group which also consisted of KIU (who'd been keen to remind me of my lifetime ban the last time we were there. Luckily I wouldn't actually have to go in the pub.), One Erection and Prince Crashpian, while Local Knowledge led a walkers group. After waving hi's to those already ambling around and eventually getting our heads round the

car park ticket machines (as this came under St. Bernard's jurisdiction there was some question of whether we would need tickets, or if they were even monitoring the car parks, but the overriding view was that the National Trust would need the money!) we headed over the stile towards the quim itself, at which point we almost lost Keeps It Up. With most of us refusing to check down and KIU calling on the in-trail, it took the hare to get us heading down the valley. From there we had a cunning trail that constantly seemed to defy the logical direction as we meandered west through the woods up and down, eventually popping out in Poynings to head round the back, through the






farm and up Newtimber. Obviously the sip would be at Saddlescombe, so we went right only to get the call left and a scarcity of marks. A vertical ascent was followed by a lovely long anticipatory downhill section into Saddlescombe where there was no beer after all. Slightly disillusioned we continued up the other side veering away from the SDW at the check to find, hurrah, Anybody waiting for us with some excellent refreshments and hand gel. Re-motivated, with the exception of Angel who was suffering sciatica, we rejoined the SDW for the on inn, gathering the remaining walkers Wildbush, Trouble and Come Again up at the end, the injured Summer Lady and Local Knowledge having strategically stopped at the Royal Oak en route. Lovely to see





It's a learning curve but some additional guidance came out of the pod hashes so far:

- As many of the marks had been washed on Monday, one point that was made (by the hare!) was that perhaps the hare should go with the first pod so that trail could be re-marked if necessary for the later groups.
- For my money I feel that it should be one and on at checks. Even in full pods of 6 we don't have the numbers to chase falsies, and the pod regroup once trail is found should be sufficient to ensure individuals don't get lost. This is not going to be the full hash experience for a little while so it is important that pods are not caught at a check for too long and risk the next pod hearing their calls or, worse, actually catching up!
- Hounds if you book in for a time, please ensure you keep to it as far as possible. You may have taken a place from another hasher and you do not endear yourself by not turning up. A certain allowance should be made for weather, but at least remove your name from the list so that we're not hanging around waiting, which buggers up the timings for the rest of the hash and risks bunching.

And finally and possibly most importantly,


- If your pod does get caught by the pod behind, all hashers should still be mindful of the need for social distancing. If the second pod is clearly stronger, let them hash through, but you should still stay with your own pod.
- There are good reasons for this and it could jeopardise our experience if we do not comply. English Athletics is clear that in an environment that is not COVID secure, "activity can take place for up to six runners not from the same family household but adhering to the latest social distancing guidance" i.e. 1 metre. If someone from the general public decides to report a grouping of more as has inadvertently happened, we may be asked to cease the activity spoiling it for everybody, as well as the wider hash community. There are also insurance implications on disregarding the guidelines as well as the possibility of fines being imposed.
- Another point here is that there are a number of hashers who do not yet feel comfortable with joining in. Pod hashing is at a very early stage and we are learning as we go, but disregarding the few rules we have had to put in place will not give them the confidence that we have things under control. There are many who have had to go through a very difficult period of isolation and the last thing we want to do is put up barriers to them re-joining the hash.
- In short, please consider if the levels of chosen in your appropriate for your ability, and change, if necessary and possible, before the run!

Off track coaching and leading including road running

- Athletes and runners training in a public space, other than a track and field facility, can take place in unlimited numbers as long as the activity is taking place within a **COVID secure environment** setting. If a COVID secure environment is not in place the following will apply; activity can take place on a oneto-five basis only (i.e. one coach or leader and up to five athletes or runners OR up to six athletes and runners with no coach or leader present). These individuals do not need to be from the same family household, but all must adhere to the latest social distancing guidance
- Athletes and runners should adhere to all restrictions that may be placed on a public space by the owner of that space.
- Athletes and runners should ensure they carry out standard safety procedures (e.g. phones, route planning etc) when accessing 'wild' public spaces.
- Athletes aiming to access trails and mountains or public spaces a long way from assistance and emergency services should make themselves aware of any local guidance / considerations prior to travel / training. Consideration of whether the activity could add to pressure on emergency services should be taken

Now we're starting to get going again, the next problem is finding hash marking materials.
