It's from outside The Downs Hotel in Woodingdean, BN2 6BB. The trail is likewise possessed of the new sound effects and announcements. And has a 'circle' of one, or per your household / bubble / plus-one.

For the unencumbered, visible on your phone are the start/end square, and four circles showing the initial direction. Your phone audibly 'echoes' blobs, checks, etc, when in the vicinity. There's a r*nners and w*lkers route. For this trail, find enroute the 'r*nners this way' echo or 'w*lkers this way' echo.


To r*n or w*lk the trail, grab the free shaky ECHOES app from the Android/iPhone appstore, if you haven't already. Just search in the appstore for 'echoes'. The icon looks a bit like a fingerprint. And proceed per the waffle at the above link.

To view all of the sash trails, head to https://explore.echoes.xyz/, scroll down to the 'Find your next adventure' box, type sash, and press Enter.



Sticky Balls and I Need One Henfield 20/11/20: Today we decided to give this Sashing another go.





On the Thunderball! Bond actor Sean Connery stars in a long-lost 1960 charity football line-up photo - in a team also featuring crooner Des O'Connor By ANTHONY JOSEPH FOR MAILONLINE 18/8/15 | UPDATED: 31/10/2020



A photo has been unearthed of Sean Connery starring in a charity football match well before the introduction of Soccer Aid and regular proams. The James Bond actor, then 30, was playing alongside some big names in sport and showbiz at the time, including TV presenter and comedian Des O'Connor. The picture, which was found this week, is from August 1960 and was taken at Crawley Town's ground, Town Mead. He is said to have broken down the defence of the Sportsmen's XI on a number occasions and even created goalscoring opportunities. The crowd were treated to a rare spectacle, as they watched the game in aid of the Showbiz Fund and the Dedham Convalescent Home for Children. The match was refereed by 1956 FA Cup final whistler Alf Bond, but there is no known record of who actually won. Dr No and Thunderball actor, Connery, has never hidden his love for the beautiful game. In his younger days, the Connery played for Fet-Lor Amateurs

and Bonnyrigg Rose in Midlothian. He was even offered a contract to play for Manchester United by manager Sir Matt Busby. The Scottish actor, 73, shocked many football supporters when he announced he had switched allegiances from boyhood club Celtic to their fiercest rivals Rangers in 2008. O'Connor, 83, was briefly a professional footballer for Northampton Town when he was evacuated to the East Midlands during the Second World War.






