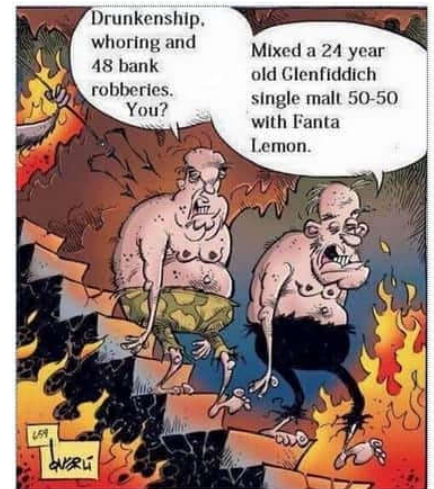
# St. Andrews Day Scottish quiz answers (see #292)

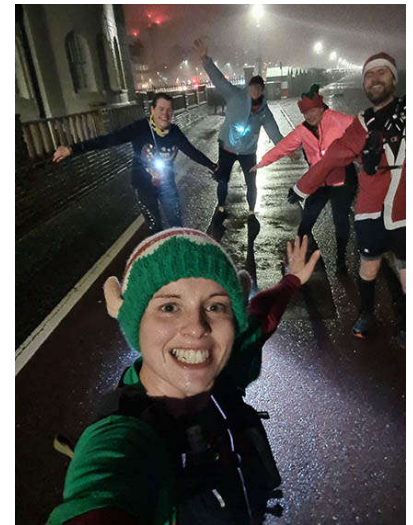


## POD-REHASHING

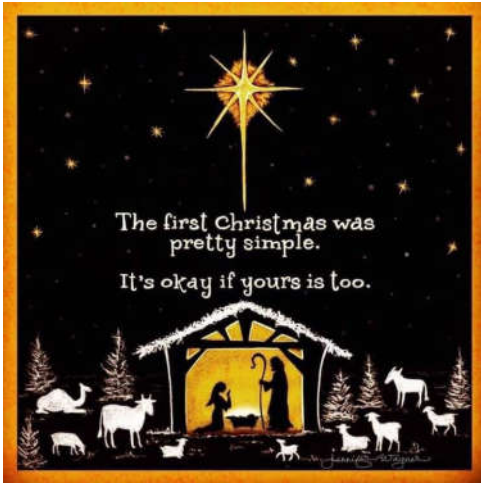

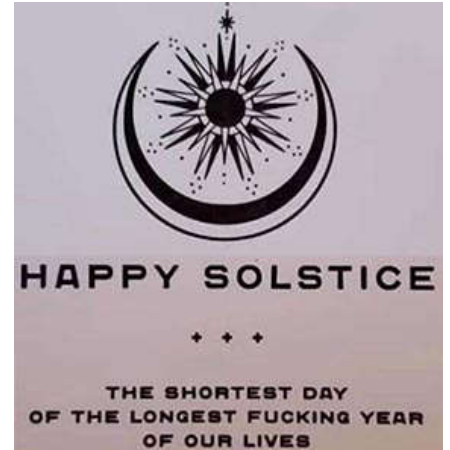

## ZOOM-REHASHING and the Christmas Star



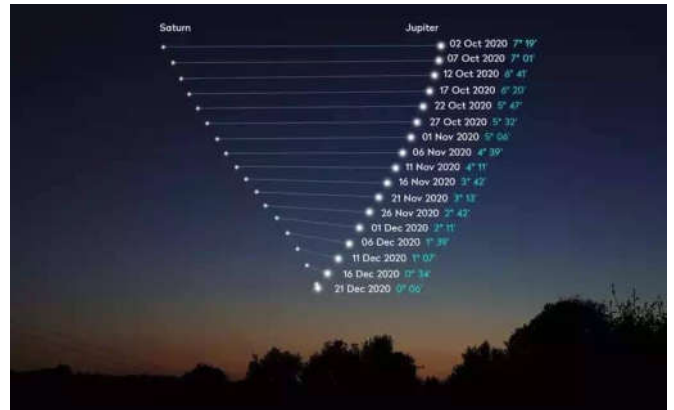

## ReZooming the hash



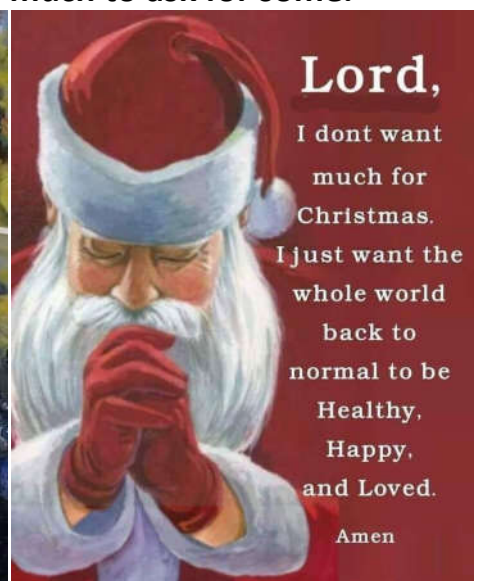

**Unfortunate lorry drivers stuck overnight on motorways in and around Kent, unable to move due to the border closure, will be charged council tax for 'residing' in the area.**

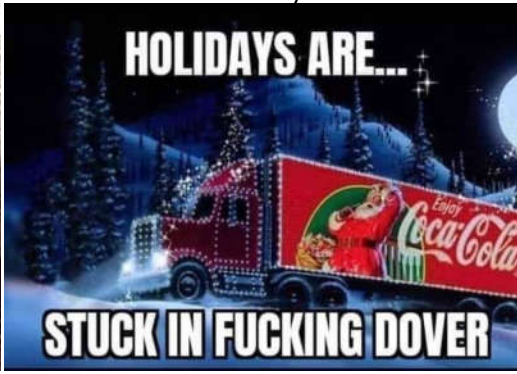
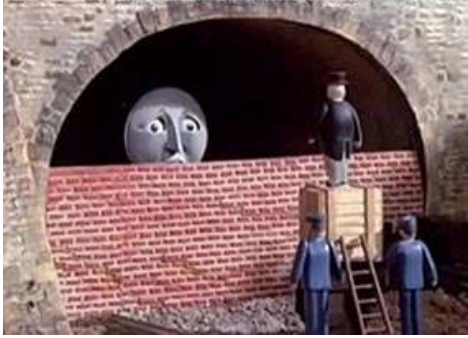

"Thus, they have entered into an unwritten contract with the local government and are liable for an

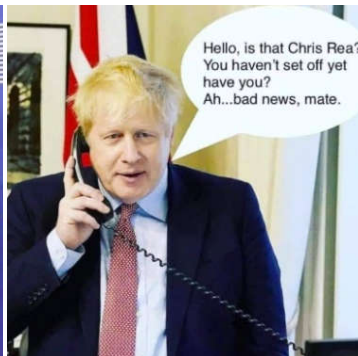
